Germany condemns the ongoing violence in <u>Nicaragua</u> and calls on all parties to renounce violence immediately. Germany welcomes the decision to establish an Interdisciplinary Group of Independent Experts to support investigation of acts of violence in Nicaragua and calls for the constructive participation of all sides in the National Dialogue.

We are deeply concerned about ongoing threats to freedom of expression, online as well as offline. Journalists and bloggers, including of foreign media, are being intimidated, harassed, subjected to overt censorship, threat of prosecution on vague charges, imprisonment, including short term detention, or physical violence, i. a. in <u>Cuba</u>, <u>Iran</u>, <u>Sudan</u>, <u>Turkmenistan</u>, <u>or Vietnam</u>, to name some. It is

imperative for all of us to protect journalists and bloggers from harassment and violence and to respect, protect and promote freedom of expression.

In closing, Mr High Commissioner, allow me once again to express our sincere gratitude for your outstanding and excellent work and that of your Office as a strong and independent advocate of human rights. Germany fully supports the work of the <u>OHCHR</u>, and we are looking forward to continuing our cooperation with your office.
